

declared a protected area, in 2003 the Management Body was established and since 2006 it has been

designated as a National Park.



There is an impressive number of plants and animals in the area, with more than **360 species of plants** and 410 representatives of fauna. However, what renders this habitat unique are the **birds of prey**, as 36 of the 38 species of diurnal predators in Europe have been traced here: one can see the chrysaetos ('gold eagle'), the vasilaetos ('king eagle'), the kravgaetos, the stiktaetos ('spotted eagle'), the thalassaetos ('sea eagle') and the fidaetos ('snake eagle'). Moreover, three of the four species of vultures in Europe breed here. These are the vulture, the white vulture and mainly the black vulture, whose only Balkan colony lies in this wood, with a population of 30-35 breeding pairs and 120-130 individual birds. The number of black storks nesting in the area is also extremely important.





The Municipality's eastern and more flat area is dominated by Evros river. The longest of the rivers flowing entirely in the Balkans forms a landscape of high aesthetic value. For centuries the life-giving river that brought culture and economic prosperity was highly worshiped in Thrace, while even today it affects its economic life; at the same time, it constitutes the border that separates Greece and the European Union from Turkey.
